



## Archery Shoot Etiquette

The following is a list of **DO's** and **DON'Ts**, which are considered good manners and archer's etiquette so everyone can enjoy archery.

### **A Good Archer will:**

Arrive early to ensure they get placed with an appropriate group.

(If a youth) ask your parent or guardian to register you and find your shooting partners.

Always leave time for your warm-up exercises and warm-up shots.

Will always help to put out equipment (score sheets, targets, etc) and help put them away.

Not walk up and down the lines and compare shooting scores.

Not offer advice unless asked.

Not touch another archer's or scorer's equipment unless asked.

Not talk in a loud voice while others are shooting.

Not pester other archers for or about their scores.

Be careful and respectful around all archery equipment.

Not leave litter on the archery range.

Stay well behind the waiting line when you are not shooting.

Do not talk to or distract anyone on the shooting line.

Be patient with the scorer and always stand to the side when pulling arrows.

Always return to the red line and hang up your bow when you have finished shooting.



## Club Rules

These rules are to be followed at any club function (Canbow, League Night or Tournaments) and are a combination of the Woodstock Archery Club and the Federation of Canadian Archers rules.

Failure to follow these rules could result in disciplinary action by the Woodstock Archery Club.

If arrows are being scored, do not touch them or the target until all scores have been taken, otherwise your score will not be counted.

**Absolutely no running or horseplay on the shooting range.**

Always carry arrows with the points down or in a quiver.

Shooting is done in a rotation so everyone gets an opportunity to shoot.

**Cheating of any kind will not be tolerated. Violators will be asked to leave. This is one rule that will cause a disqualification. ( NO WARNINGS!)**

No rough housing the targets. This includes climbing on them or throwing them as they are expensive to replace.

Listen to the instructions of any person in charge of an archery event.

Scorekeepers will assume control of the group, and have control over any youth under the age of 13.

**Safety is our number one concern.**

**Parents of any archer under the age of 13 are asked to accompany their child to any archery function or have an adult be responsible for them that will be in at.**
